### Fire at the Pines of Perinton

On Tuesday moming, a fire broke out at the Pines of Perinton apartment complex here in Fairport and destroyed the homes of at least 40 families. We thank God that no one was seriously injured and grieve at the devastating loss of housing for so many. Our Fairport community has reached out in abundance to those whose homes were damaged or destroyed by the fire. We have been working behind the scenes with our local community to see what we can best offer to help during this traumatic time. Here is what is needed at this time:

Financial Aid: The Town of Perinton has created a Pines of Perinton Fund for victims of the tragedy. Please consider donating to this fund. Checks can be brought or mailed to the Town Hall (1350 Turk Hill Rd., Fairport).

Clothing: Please refrain at this time from donating clothing until the current offerings have been sorted and the need can be more accurately advertised.

Housing: If you currently have an available apartment, or know someone that does, please consider offering housing to one of the many families who are now homeless as a result of the fire. You may contact the Town of Perinton with your details.

Non Perishable Food Goods: Non perishable food goods are needed and may be donated through the <u>Perinton</u> Food Shelf.
