Fire at the Pines of Perinton

A fire broke out at the Pines of Perinton apartment complex here in Fairport and destroyed the homes of at least 40 families. We thank God that no one was seriously injured and grieve at the devastating loss of housing for so many. Our Fairport community has reached out in abundance to those whose homes were damaged or destroyed by the fire. We have been working behind the scenes with our local community to see what we can best offer to help during this traumatic time. Here is what is needed at this time:

Financial Aid: The Town of Perinton has created a Pines of Perinton Fund for victims of the tragedy. Please consider donating to this fund. Checks can be brought or mailed to the Town Hall (1350 Turk Hill Rd., Fairport).

Clothing: Please refrain at this time from donating clothing until the current offerings have been sorted and the need can be more accurately advertised.

Housing: If you currently have an available apartment, or know someone that does, please consider offering housing to one of the many families who are now homeless as a result of the fire. You may contact the Town of Perinton with your details.

Non Perishable Foods: Non perishable food are needed and may be donated through the Perinton Food Shelf.

Thanks to your continued support of the 50/50 Fund, Outreach has made a \$500 donation to the Pines of Perinton Fund to help out all the individuals impacted by the recent fire.

From our Finance Committee

First and foremost, THANK YOU for your continued support and generosity. Due to this, and due to efforts made by our staff and committees to reduce ex-

penses, our net proceeds (revenue less expenses) for 2021 were \$18,000. This is a significant improvement over 2020 (-\$5,000).

Our church is presently in a sound financial position, in part due to the forgiveness of the CARES/PPP loan of \$45,000 received last year. Though our 2021 revenues decreased by 7% from pre-pandemic levels (2019), our expenses decreased by 8%.

In the coming year, our ministries and committees are hoping to return to much needed pre-pandemic levels of funding in order to carry out their ministry to our members, community, and world. (See article re: 2022 budget below.)

Church Council: 2022 Budget

The Church Council passed a budget of \$428,000, at its January meeting. (This is a significant reduction from the pre-pandemic 2019 budget of \$446,000). Finance's best estimates at this time are for revenues of \$421,000 in 2022. By passing a small deficit budget, Church Council felt that it is important to restore and revitalize our ministry areas. In addition, a much deserved increment was approved for our staff. Thank you once again for your generosity and support, as well as your gifts of time and talent!
