Nametags at Fairport UMC!

We are re-introducing and creating new nametags here at FUMC. One addition to our nametags is that we will begin offering and encouraging putting pronouns on name tags. At FUMC, we strive to be a community that encourages people to be their genuine selves. We welcome people whose gender identity doesn't neatly fall into one of the two categories most of us were taught growing up. Two sets of gendered pronouns do not always serve us very well.

Reasons to Share Pronouns on your Nametag:

- o I share mine because I don't want anyone to feel unsafe or unwelcome and I think this helps.
- o I think that sharing my pronouns helps everyone feel included and respected.
- o Sharing my pronouns helps make FUMC a more welcoming place for people of all genders.
- o I want to make sure that everyone gets my name and pronouns right every time; I also want to make sure I get everyone else's right, too.
- o I believe it's more respectful not to

assume someone's gender based on how I think they look. I'm sharing mine so that you won't have to assume either. I share mine because I am an active ally.

all people at FUMC.
