COVID-19 Safety Update

On June 20th, the Reopening Task Force met for the last time. Over the last 2 years 10 -12 members of Fairport UMC have met regularly to keep our church and community safe. They did an amazing job keeping up to date with the research and recommendations from national/state/conference levels. The committee was made up of medical professionals, staff and church leaders (from all different ministry areas).

A special thanks to Martha McNeill and Lesley Dollard who co-chaired the team and led us through some very difficult times. And a huge thank you to the whole team who put in countless hours to help our church!

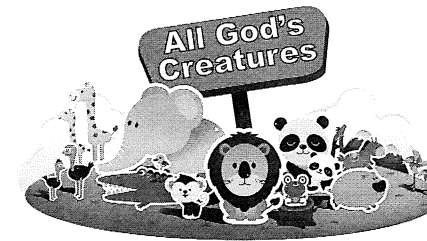
For two years, the FUMC Reopening Task Force has worked diligently to provide information to the congregation regarding the status of COVID-19 in our community. We have implemented practices, based on state and federal guidelines, to keep the staff and members of the congregation safe while we carried on as a church. Some may have felt protected by the guidelines we established while others may have felt oppressed but the safety of the congregation and staff was always our first priority.

When the Task Force met about two months ago, we agreed to follow the parameters established by the CDC instead of those established by Covid Act Now as we had been doing. But even at that time, we elected to be more conservative in our approach than the CDC recommended.

We met again this week and agreed to follow the CDC guidelines and recommendations. This will allow individual members to use their own discretion about attendance, mask wearing, distancing, etc. while we remain in either the Low or Medium Community Level, as established by the CDC. If we move back into the High level, we will continue to follow CDC guidelines but may need to address masking, distancing, in-person gatherings, etc. in our ongoing effort to maintain the safety of all.

Our team also elected to disband the Reopening Task Force and will move ahead with a much smaller group who will meet as needed. This group, the COVID-19 Safety Team, will consist of Pastor Richelle Goff, Nicole Camilleri, Joy Leinenbach, Kevin Gordon, Tobin Woodruff, and physicians Jane Pardee and Joe DiPoala. They will continue the work of the Task Force to keep us safe through this ever-evolving pandemic.
